Enjoy rest and recreation on your doorstep



How much will a fibreglass pool cost?

Obviously, the price will be a big factor when it comes to deciding, but there are many factors that will influence the price of your swimming pool.

An entry level price for the purchase and installation of a fibreglass swimming pool typically sits between \$25-\$45k and that price could range upwards of \$65k from there.



You're right in thinking that that is a massive variation, but consider perhaps the purchase of a family car and the variation that can be associated with those costs. There are many variables when it comes to purchasing a pool such as:

- Access to site
- Soil conditions
- Size & Shape of the chosen pool
- Additional features you may choose to enhance the look of your pool area
- The quality of the pool and pool equipment you choose.




What size pool do I need?

Go back to the start of this guide and revisit your reasons for purchasing a pool. Different needs mean different size requirements or recommendations.



If you have a large, young family and the pool will be used often, then you may want to go for a more sizeable pool that can accommodate everyone without feeling like sardines! You definitely do not want the children jumping on top of each other. Bigger is better for a minimal cost increase, especially if you have the room.

Or maybe you want to use the pool for exercise and you will be doing laps often. Then the length of the pool will be more important to you.



Perhaps there are only two of you that will ever be in the pool at one time. You won't require as much space if you only plan on using it to cool down in summer.

Nonetheless, you certainly don't want to install your pool and decide after that it wasn't big enough. It's a good idea to mark out the pool you are considering in the area you would like the pool to go with tape or spray paint. This will give you an idea if it is big enough.



What pool style and colour should I choose?

Choosing a pool style and colour is a hard but very important decision and is completely personal. Countrywide Pools can guide you based on your initial requirements and it is important to remember that these elements will really set the mood in your outdoor area.




You are not limited when it comes to choices, there are a variety of different styles and colours available. Some popular styles are:

- Contemporary Square The square edges of this modern and sophisticated style are all about straight lines and minimalistic features. Current trends make this our mo9st popular shape sold.
- Grand Entry Style These typically feature shallow end entry steps which allow for greater choice of pool position and provide the perfect spot for relaxation.
- Lagoon style The curved lagoon style gives a resort type feel. These usually have a waterfall feature to give off visual and acoustic ambiance.

When choosing a style, here are some things you may want to consider:

- Square or straight edge pools are easier to pave
- You can choose additional water & light features to enhance the look of the pool
- What landscaping look and feel are you aiming for?
- What will be surrounding the pool? (think falling leaves, sand, dust etc.)





When it comes to choosing a pool colour, we highly recommend you ask Countrywide Pools to show you some pools they have completed in the colours you like. A photo is never accurate, and a small sample colour square just wont give you the full picture especially as the colour can change drastically once the water is in the pool.

Deciding is much easier when you have seen a pool with all the landscaping completed. It will be hard to get an idea of what your pool will look like from a work site that is is still in progress.





Do I need Shire approval?

Yes, generally a building permit is require under the Building Act 2011 to construct or install a swimming pool or spa pool and its associated safety barrier. Although, there are some exceptions, mainly based on localities. A reputable pool company will take care of all shire approvals on your behalf. They will have the knowledge and experience to obtain your swimming pool building permit hassle free. The building permit will have to include the safety barrier, but be sure to check your pool quote to see if this included in your pool builders scope of works. Typically, the barrier is completed by your chosen landscaper.





What is the actual process of building a pool?

The process is straightforward and lead time from start to the finish of install can be as little as 2-3 days, but typically can take up to a week.

Step 1 - Building Approval/SPASA Contract

We will process all paperwork and documents and submit building applications to the Shire for approval on your behalf. We will also prepare your SPASA Contract (your Completion Guarantee)



Step 2 - Dig & Prep

We will come to your property and peg out where the pool will go and the hole will be dug with an excavator. We then screed and prep the whole for pool install

Step 3 - Install

We will transport the pool from Perth and use a crane to carefully lower your pool into the hole. It is then checked to ensure it is perfectly level.

Step 3 - Backfill & Water

We then backfill around your pool. Countrywide Pools choose to use Stabilised Backfill which is a mix of Cracker Dust and Cement. There are many benefits of using this method but the main one is that it offers improved subgrade stability and reduces the potential for your paving or even pool to subside.




We fill with water at the same time to ensure that there are no issues with the pool shell cracking or bowing due to either the pressure of the cement on the outside or water on the inside. This combination of backfilling and water filling creates a more stable environment.

Step 4 - Plumbing of filtration equipment

Our pool technician will install and plumb your filtration equipment. They will also do a final clean and water balance as well as go over a full handover with your to make sure you a re happy with how your new equipment works.

Step 4 - Your pool is complete! It is now time for you to jump in and enjoy your new investment!


